

HOW TO FIND US

To get to ENSP Rennes

By car

ENSP is located in "Avenue du Professeur Léon Bernard" in north west Rennes.

From Paris - Le Mans: take the south ring-road following "Rennes city center - Nantes", then take the exit "Vézin Le Coquet" (see map).

From Nantes - Bordeaux: take the ring-road following the "Saint-Brieuc - Brest" signs, then take the exit "Vezin-le-Coquet" (see map).

From Caen: take the north ring-road following the "Saint-Brieuc - Brest" signs, then take the exit : "Beauregard - Villejean" (see map).



By train

Getting from the train station to the ENSP

Take the underground directly from the main train station towards "JF Kennedy" and leave the underground at "Villejean Université" station. Then go down "Gaston Berger" Avenue (300 m.). Turn left into "Avenue Professeur Léon Bernard", the school entrance is on the right, opposite the University.

Health and social welfare policies: International experiences, French perspectives

What perceptions do health and social welfare professionals have of the new challenges in this field in Europe and what lessons can be learned from the experiences of their European counterparts? Are there common problematics among countries sharing the French language, what initiatives are being undertaken in these countries, and what forms can the French support take in terms of cooperation in this sector?



The National School of Public Health (ENSP) organises a 2-day event on current themes which are common to European countries as well as French-speaking countries around the world, in order to allow current and future professionals to draw on the experiences of ENSP trainees during their practical placement abroad in health or social welfare facilities, local authorities, or NGOs. This IIIrd forum will build on the first two events held in 2005



and 2006 and will innovate by integrating in 2007 a conference-debate and workshops dedicated to the Balkan region (Albania, Bosnia-and-Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Macedonia, Montenegro, Romania, Serbia, Slovenia) and Moldova.



Trainee hospital managers (2006-2008 class) and trainee social welfare institutions managers (2006-2007 class) will communicate on each theme, by trying to place the debates within a broader context. Following their foreign placement, the students will present their placement experience in various forms, as well as solutions enabling health and social systems to meet current and future needs.
